

More formally, the IANA Service Level Targets are defined in part by the contract for IANA performance with the US Department of Commerce, as well as in the Memorandum of Understanding with the IETF.



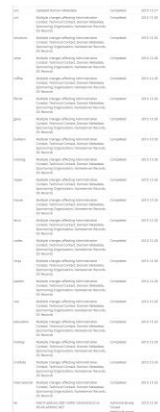

# IANA Customer Survey – 2013 Results




- + Extremely high satisfaction reported by respondents

This consultation asks for input on how well the system works and whether ICANN should be asked to cover their reasonable travel costs
